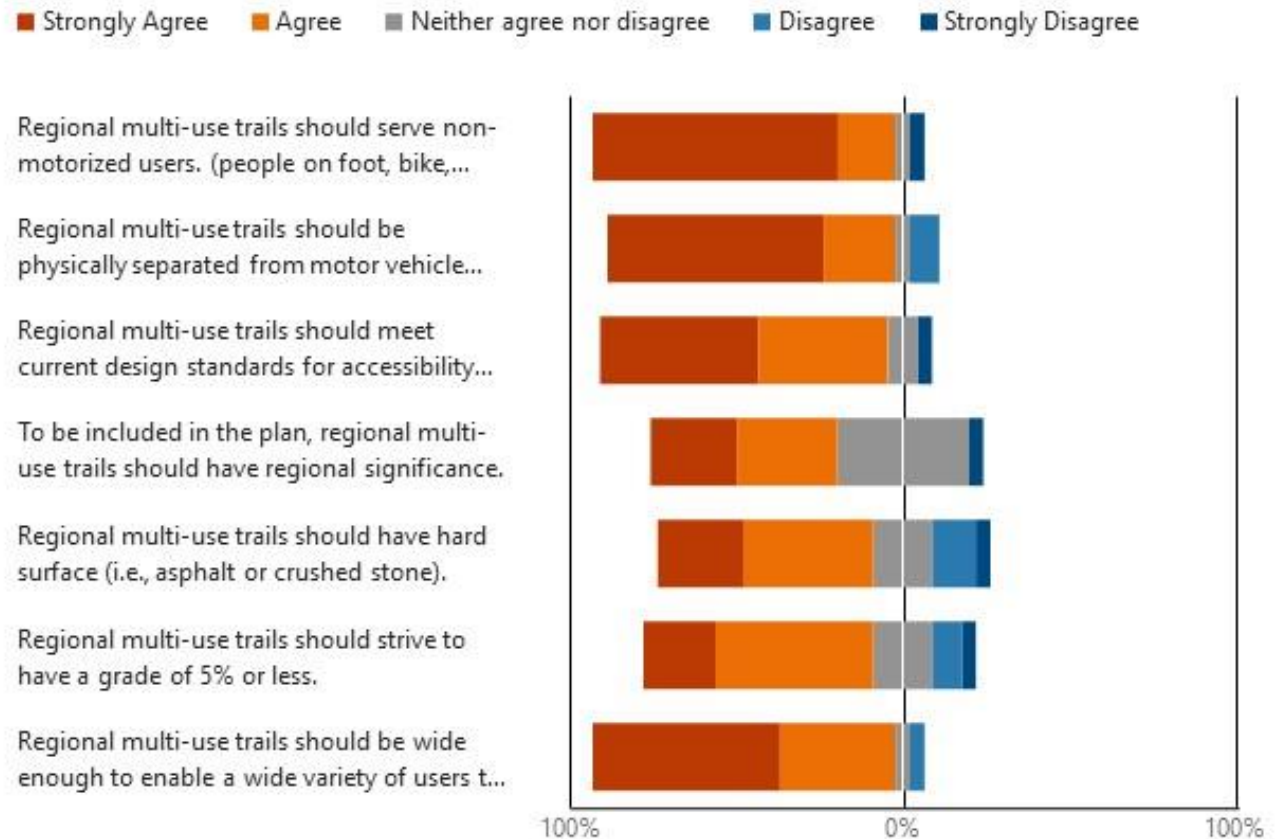

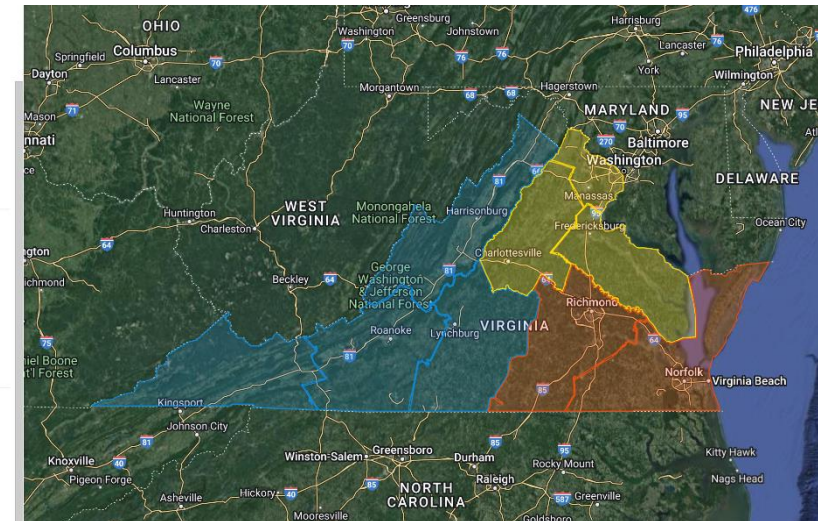

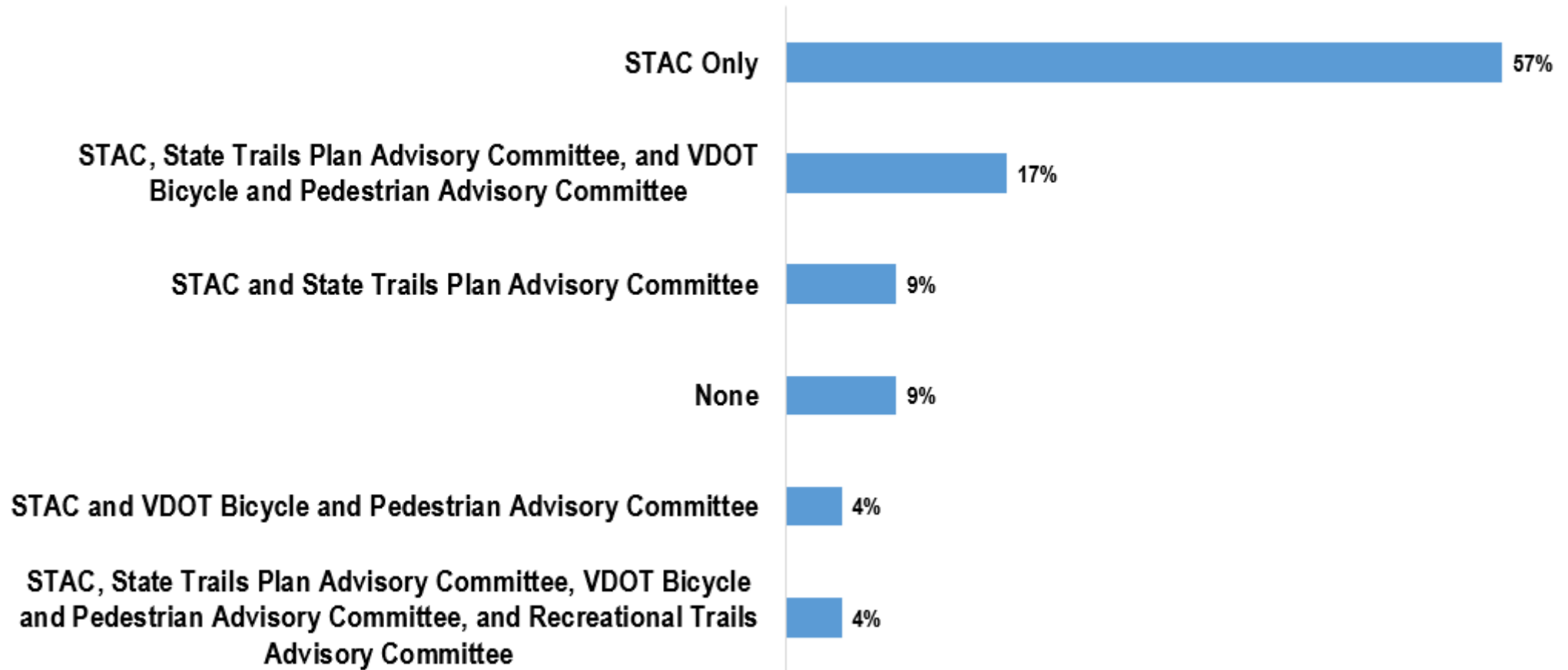

Code Excerpt

“The State Trails Advisory Committee is hereby established as an advisory committee of the Department of Conservation and Recreation to assist the Commonwealth in developing and implementing a statewide system of attractive, sustainable, connected, and enduring trails for the perpetual use and enjoyment of the citizens of the Commonwealth and future generations.”

STAC Survey Overview

Code Excerpt

The Advisory Committee shall examine and provide recommendations regarding:

- Options to close the gaps in a statewide system of trails as described in § 10.1-204.1
- Creative public and private funding strategies and partnerships to leverage resources to fund the development of trails
- Integrated approaches to promote and market trail values and benefits
- The development of specialty trails, including concepts related to old-growth forest trails
- Strategies to encourage and create linkages between communities and open space
- Strategies to foster communication and networking among trail stakeholders
- Strategies to increase tourism and commercial activities associated with a statewide trail system
- Strategies to enhance the involvement of organizations that promote outdoor youth activities...
- Other practices, standards, statutes, and guidelines... including methods for receiving input regarding potential trail impacts upon owners of underlying or neighboring properties
