

RULES/REGULATIONS TO CAMP AT BAKER ISLAND:

MUST READ BEFORE RESERVING A SITE HERE!

Baker Island Campground is part of the New River Trail State Park and New River Canoe Trail. Although the island consists of ecosystems very similar to those on the mainland, the isolation of some vegetation and wildlife, and the potential for concentrated impact by humans, requires very specific and strict regulations for campground use. The island is patrolled regularly and failure to comply with the regulations will be grounds for removal from the island.

Access to Baker Island is by kayak or canoe only – **you are responsible for your access.**

No drinking water is available on Baker Island - **bring your own drinking water.**

No trash receptacles are available on Baker Island – all left over food, trash and litter must be removed by campers. **Littering or disposal of trash in vault toilets is strictly prohibited.**

Vault toilets are available for human waste ONLY – human waste not disposed of in the vaults creates unsanitary and unsightly conditions.

All camping equipment, including tents, must be placed on the site pad.

Stay on designated trails.

Carry water away from the river's edge to wash yourself or your dishes – do not dump used water in the river.

Use dead and down limbs for fires and **only build fires in the fire-rings provided.**

Public use or display of alcoholic beverages is prohibited by state law.
