

While at Occoneechee...

Take time from your fun on the water and travel back in time by visiting the manor house and gardens at Prestwood Plantation. The plantation is open mid April through October.

The town of Clarksville, 1.5 miles west of the park, provides such services as lodging, restaurants, service stations, grocery and beverage supplies, fishing and hunting supplies and licenses, laundromat facilities, medical assistance and worship services.

Campground rules

- Camping is allowed only in designated campgrounds and only after following the proper check-in procedure.
- Campsites are designed to be used by a maximum of six people, or one family.
- Two motor vehicles, in addition to the camping unit, are permitted per site. Only the camping unit listed on the campsite application is permitted. Additional vehicles will be charged a daily parking fee.
- State park campgrounds are intended for the use of the traveling public and not for extended or seasonal camping. The maximum camping stay per park is 14 days per 30-day period.
- Check-out time is 3 p.m. No camping units, vehicles or personal property may be left or allowed to remain on site after the termination of the permitted camping period.
- Fires must be confined to grills, campstoves or designated fire rings.
- Laundry sinks provided are to be used only for washing clothes.
- Quiet hours are 10 p.m. to 8 a.m.

- Pets are allowed in state park campgrounds. There is a \$5 fee plus tax per pet per night.
- At the time of registration, campers must inform park staff of the names of visitors expected to arrive at the campsite. Visitors will not be admitted to camping area unless so identified. No visitors are allowed before 8 a.m., and visitors must leave before 10 p.m.
- The public use or display of alcoholic beverages is prohibited. Public intoxication and/or disorderly conduct will not be tolerated.
- All vehicles and equipment must be kept within the framed impact area.

Cabin Information

- State park cabins are rented on a weekly or nightly basis. The weekly reservation period runs from Saturday to Saturday or Sunday to Sunday. Check-in is at 3 p.m. and check-out is at 10 a.m. Maximum cabin rental is two consecutive weeks. Those cabins not reserved on a weekly basis may be rented at a nightly rate for a minimum of two nights.
- Maximum occupancy per cabin type is as follows.

Two Bedroom	Sleeps 6
Three Bedroom	Sleeps 8
Six Bedroom	Sleeps 16
- One vehicle per cabin bedroom is permitted at each cabin and must be parked in the space provided.
- Boat trailer parking is also provided at each cabin.

Frequent visitors save money

Welcome to Occoneechee State Park. Whether you call it Buggs Island Lake or the Kerr Reservoir, boating and fishing access to the state's largest freshwater lake is the major attraction of this park named after the Occoneechee Indians (pronounced O-KO-NEE-CHEE). Lakefront picnicking, shaded campsites and wooded hiking trails are also popular activities here. New attractions include a playground and summer interpretive programs. To make your visit a safer and more pleasant one, we ask that you observe the following regulations.



Swimming from the shoreline is not permitted. Steep drop-offs, boating traffic and underwater objects make swimming and wading hazardous.



Pets are permitted in all state parks but must be kept in an enclosed area or on a leash no longer than six feet.



The public use or display of alcoholic beverages is prohibited.

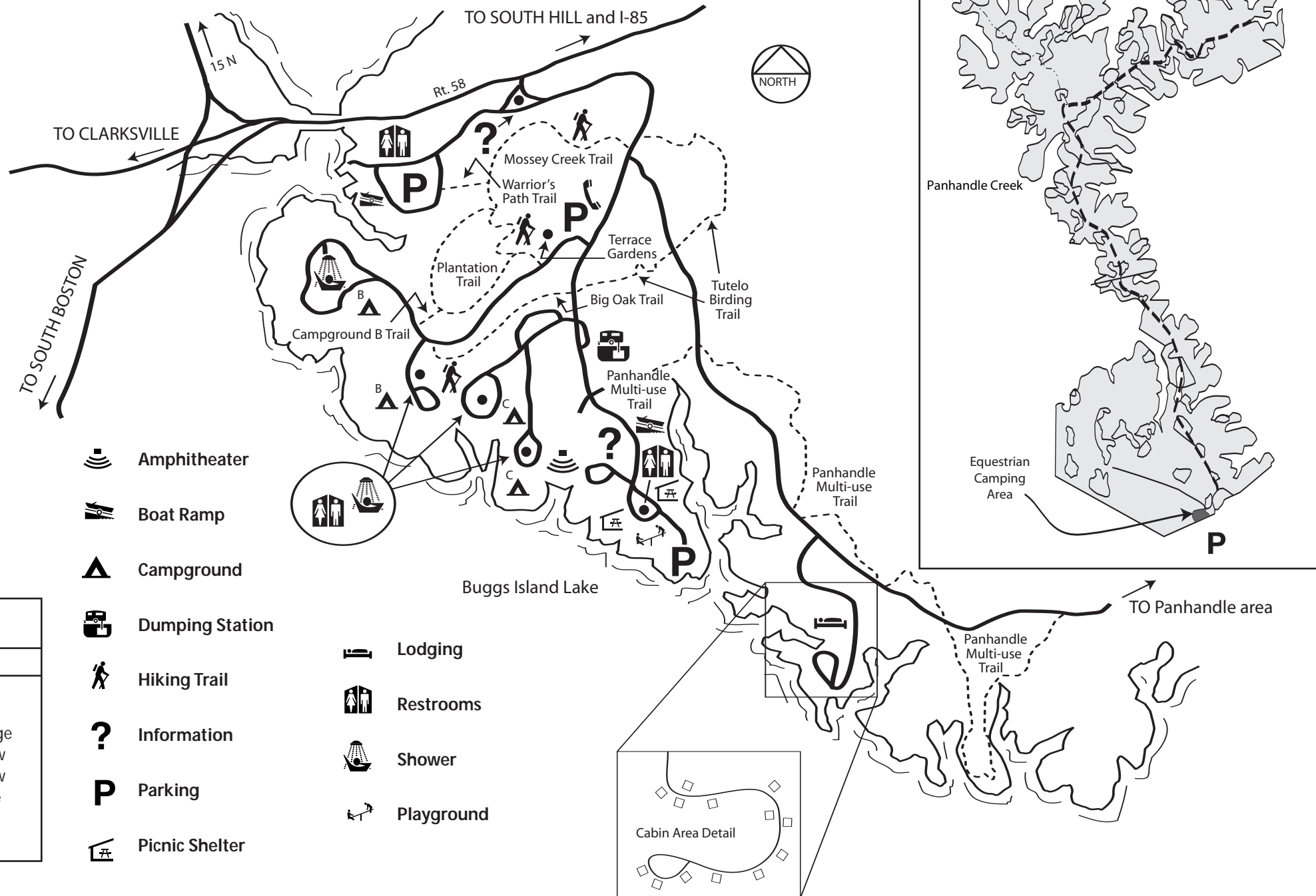


The park is open for day use from 8 a.m. to dusk.
