Scope of Work Narrative – Capacity Building and Planning

Introduction

The Northern Neck is a peninsula in Eastern Virginia bounded by the Potomac River, Rappahannock River, and the Chesapeake Bay. The roughly 740-square-mile peninsula includes the Counties of Westmoreland, Richmond, Northumberland, and Lancaster, and the Towns of Colonial Beach, Montross, Warsaw, Kilmarnock, White Stone, and Irvington. In 2019, the estimated population of the Northern Neck was 49,736.

The Northern Neck Planning District Commission (NNPDC) is proposing to update the Northern Neck Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan. The current Plan, created in 2006 and last updated in 2017, will be the basis for this new update expected to be completed in 2022. As in previous updates, the Northern Neck Planning District Commission and its consultants will incorporate not only the existing Hazard Mitigation Plan in the process but also relevant content from other available regional plans, such as our Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy plan (currently being updated), regional Emergency Operations Plan, regional Hazardous Materials Emergency Response Plan, Solid Waste Management Plan, Water Supply Plan, Groundwater Management Plan, Rural Transportation Plan, and others. A copy of the current Hazard Mitigation Plan and the other aforementioned plans can be found at http://www.northernneck.us/archive/

The scope of work will include a review and update/revision of the Northern Neck Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan that was approved by FEMA in early 2018. The update will involve an evaluation and revision of the various sections of the plan, including a revised planning process, capability assessment, Hazard Identification and Risk Assessment (HIRA), vulnerability assessment, and plan maintenance. Mitigation strategies will also be reviewed, evaluated, and updated to better prepare the participating localities for the risks associated with the hazards addressed in the plan. Information on hazards that have occurred since the 2017 update will be included in the revision, and data on estimated losses, repetitive-loss properties, and properties at risk will be updated to the greatest extent possible. Land-use data for the region will be updated for the plan, based on information from local comprehensive plans and other plans. In addition, updated FIRM data, where available, will be used to map the flood hazard areas of each locality.

Capacity Needs and Assets

The NNPDC and its member jurisdictions are rural in nature and operate with limited resources, funding, and technical capacity. For this reason, the NNPDC is requesting monies from the Virginia Community Flood Preparedness Fund to contract with an as yet to be determined consultant to provide technical and planning expertise to the update of the Hazard Mitigation Plan. The NNPDC will facilitate the process, convene stakeholders, and engage with the public during the update.

Goals and Objectives

The update to the Hazard Mitigation Plan will address the following hazards with an emphasis on resilience building: Riverine Flooding, Coastal Flooding, Tidal Flooding, Rainfall Flooding, Coastal Erosion, Hurricanes, Severe Weather, Tornado, Winter Storm, Drought, Wildfire, Earthquakes, and Dam Safety. The update will include a holistic approach to assessing each locality's exposure risk to the specified hazards and will incorporate each locality's own self-identified resilience capacity and implementation needs.

Each locality previously participated in the Resilience Adaptation Feasibility Tool (RAFT), a year-long engagement process that scores the locality's current resilience and emphasizes the development and implementation of resilience action checklists that highlight specific resilience priorities for that locality. During the RAFT, each participating locality identified goals and objectives for building resilience capacity that will be incorporated into the Hazard Mitigation Plan and adopted by their governing body.

The update to the Hazard Mitigation Plan will incorporate goals and strategies for improving resilience building capacity with an emphasis on planning for resilience implementation. As such, the update will focus on flooding resiliency and floodplain management, including a dam safety plan. The update will utilize the Community Flood Preparedness Fund's own guidelines to incorporate the necessary elements of a resilience plan and identify where those elements can be incorporated into local plans to further drive resilience implementation. With the incorporation of locality-identified resilience measures and the elements of a resilience plan, once adopted by localities, the Hazard Mitigation Plan will serve as a commitment to resilience building and will provide a roadmap to achieving resilience from flood hazard exposure.

Stakeholder Identification, Outreach and Education strategies

With input from localities, the NNPDC will be responsible for building a steering committee that will interact with the consultant in the development of the updated plan. This planning committee will be composed of local, regional, state, and federal government officials as well as other local and regional stakeholders. At a minimum, the NNPDC plans to hold three stakeholder meetings. Information will be gathered from emergency management personnel as well as individuals in the public, who will also be invited to these meetings. The regional kick-off meeting will be to bring everyone together and review the planning process and timeline involved in the process. Each of the Hazard Identification and Risk Assessment (HIRA) sections will be revised based on current information and the updated analysis conducted by NNPDC staff and the paid consultant. The NNPDC and the paid consultant will also facilitate the review and update of mitigation strategies. The Virginia Department of Emergency Management (VDEM) will assist in providing hazard data from the state hazard mitigation plan and other assistance as needed. Once the plan is approved by FEMA, it will be given to our localities' boards of supervisors and town councils to pass a resolution adopting the plan update. The plan

will be updated according to VDEM and FEMA requirements, and any needs requested by our localities.

The Northern Neck Planning District Commission (NNPDC) works on a variety of regional activities that include the involvement of local, State, and Federal agencies on a regular basis, including, but not limited to FEMA, EDA, VDOT, DEQ, DCR, VDEM, DRPT, and VEDP. The NNPDC plans to include these agency partners in the stakeholder process. During the planning process, The NNPDC will work closely with County and Town administration staff, including local administrators, managers, land use planning, and emergency management staff. Additionally, the stakeholder process will include utilities serving the region, as well as local business representatives who participate in regular meetings of the Northern Neck-Chesapeake Bay Region Partnership and the Northern Neck Tourism Commission.

Implementation Plan and Timeline

The NNPDC will procure the services of a paid consultant to assist with the update to the Hazard Mitigation plan. The NNPDC and the paid consultant will convene a steering committee comprised of local, regional, State, and Federal stakeholders and hold a minimum of three planning meetings over the course of the year. Each of the Hazard Identification and Risk Assessment (HIRA) sections will be revised based on current information and the updated analysis conducted by the NNPDC and the paid consultant. The NNPDC and the paid consultant will also facilitate the review and update of mitigation strategies and the incorporation of locality-identified resilience measures and the elements of a resilience plan. Upon completion of the updated plan and planning meetings, the revised Hazard Mitigation Plan will be submitted to FEMA. Once the plan is approved by FEMA, the plan will be given to our localities' boards of supervisors and town councils to pass a resolution adopting the plan update.

Parties Responsible for Plan Development Process

The NNPDC will be responsible for convening the steering committee, public outreach and engagement, and facilitating planning meetings. The NNPDC will also be responsible for overall project management and coordinating with localities, VDEM, and FEMA to have the updated plan approved and adopted. The paid consultant will be responsible for coordinating the review and revision of the plan, including the incorporation of new elements and locality-identified resilience measures. The paid consultant will also be responsible for HAZUS planning, the HIRA, analysis of mitigation strategies, and any other data collection and technical analysis.

Performance Outputs and Measures and Plans for Maintaining Capacity

The updated Hazard Mitigation Plan will contain clearly identified goals and objectives for building resilience and implementing hazard mitigation strategies. These goals and objectives will contain strategies for building resilience and addressing hazard mitigation on both the regional and local scale through collaboration between localities and between localities and residents. Performance will be measured on the achievement of those goals and objectives

through an annual review process facilitated by the NNPDC over the course of the subsequent five years post-update and leading into the next update in 2027. The NNPDC will work with localities during that time to incorporate flooding resilience into other local plans to strengthen existing planning processes and address hazard exposure. Also, during that time, the NNPDC will work with localities, based on those identified goals and objectives, to identify projects that build resilience at all scales. Additionally, the NNPDC will continue to work with localities to identify and build additional local capacity for resilience.

Budget Narrative

The Northern Neck Region, consisting of Westmoreland, Richmond, Northumberland, and Lancaster counites, as represented by the Northern Neck Planning District Commission (NNPDC), qualifies as a Low-Income Geographic Area per the definitions in the CFPF Grant Manual, making the match requirement for this application 10% of CFPF project budget. The total estimated project cost is \$150,000 with \$100,000 being funded through FEMA's Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) program, \$45,000 being requested from the Community Flood Preparedness Fund and cash funds contribution of \$5,000 from the Northern Neck Planning District Commission. An Authorization to Request Funding and a Pledge Agreement are attached to this application.


Appendix A


