




Conservation Sites of Virginia

February 2018

Conservation Sites are an important tool for protecting natural heritage resources. Conservation Sites (Sites) are key areas of the landscape worthy of protection and stewardship because of the natural heritage resources (i.e. rare plants and animals, significant natural communities, and geologic features) and habitats they support. This map displays the density of Sites in each Virginia locality, using all Sites mapped through December 14, 2017. The number of Sites in each jurisdiction were totaled and divided by the total number of acres in each jurisdiction. These results were log transformed (ln) to create relative density ranks for each jurisdiction to provide a quick assessment of the distribution of Conservation Sites across the Commonwealth.
