Shenandoah River State Park is located between the Massanutten Mountains and the Blue Ridge Mountains in the Shenandoah Valley.

The park offers 11 cabins, 31 water/ electric campsites, 4 camping cabins, 10 primitive campsites, and 4 shelters. Each campground has shower facilities. We have about 26 miles of multiuse trails and 5 miles of shoreline on the Shenandoah River for fishing, canoeing and tubing.

During the summer we offer interpretive programs, tube, and kayak trips. Check the Virginia State Parks website for a schedule of programs.

Here's How Geocaching Works:

Log onto geocaching.com to get a list of coordinates that pinpoint where caches are hidden. These coordinates can be entered into a hand-held GPS unit. Don't have a GPS unit....no problem. All parks have GPS rental units that are available for a small charge. Park offices and visitor centers are open on a limited basis so he sure to call ahead if you are planning to rent a unit. Use the GPS unit to get close to where the cache is hidden. Search the area carefully to find the cache. A cache can be a notable landmark or a container that includes a logbook, small gifts left by previous players, and other items. In return, you may leave something in the cache if you choose.



Rules of Participation:

Keep geocaching fun and safe by following these common sense rules and ethics of the sport. When seeking geocaches make sure that you:

- Tread lightly on the land minimize impact on the environment. Caches are never buried underground. There should be no need to dig to find a cache.
- Never remove or relocate a cache. Once you find the cache, claim your prize and leave the cache for others to find exactly where you found it. Don't forget to sign and date the logbook.
- Do not endanger yourself or others. Follow the laws of the park.
- Try to avoid muggles (people who are not geocaching).
- Be considerate of others.
